The Library Room at the British Hotel

F&MI rents a suite at the British Hotel and extends its hours of operation. Regular public lectures begin.

Phantasmagoria Lantern Acquired

F&MI purchases a Phantasmagoria Lantern (Magic Lantern) to enhance its lecture presentations with projected images.

Ontario Free Libraries Act Passed

Ontario passes the Free Libraries Act, allowing cities and towns to establish publicly funded libraries.

Library Reading Rooms at Town Hall

The Library Reading Rooms move to Guelph's Town Hall, and library staff are officially hired.

Farmers and Mechanics Institute is Established

The Farmers and Mechanics Institute (F&MI) forms with paid memberships, located at Thomas Sandiland's Store at 3-5 Wyndham St.



1850 **A New Location**

> The Library Room relocates to a space above P.C. Allen's Bookstore, next to 53 Wyndham Street.



The Carnegie **Foundation**

Plans begin to move into a larger facility. A new property is selected, and funding from the Carnegie Foundation is pursued.

Children's **Reading Room**

Discussions begin about creating a dedicated Children's Reading Room. After its opening, the Boys & Girls Reading Room sees steady and continuous growth.

Film Screenings for Kids

The Boys & Girls Reading Room begins showing films using a donated delineascope and screen.

The Guelph Free Public Library

The Guelph Free Public Library is established and located at 137-145 Wyndham Street.

The Guelph Public Library Opens

The new Guelph Public Library opens to the public, establishing itself as a cornerstone of the community.

Books from the library and magazines from the community are sorted by the International Order of the Daughters of the Empire (I.O.D.E.) and donated to military forces.

Hospital Book Services Begin

The library launches book delivery service to hospitals, expands its archives, and introduces summer hours. The demand for library services is double the building's capacity.

Norfolk Building Expansion

The Norfolk location expands to 29,500 square feet over three levels to better serve the growing community.



Bullfrog Branch opens its doors in September 1984.

Mrs. Hugh Guthrie **Becomes Board Chair**

In 1946, Mrs. Hugh Guthrie (Margaret Murray Stuart) becomes the first woman to join the Library Board and is appointed Chair in 1948.

1951 **100 Norfolk Street Library Opens**

A modern new library building opens at 100 Norfolk Street in November 1965.


